

# Asia University Urgent Relief Fund

1. If a student suffers difficulty in their schooling as a result of a natural disaster (typhoon, flood, earthquake, fire, etc.) or unexpected major accident that causes family or individual harm, assistance will be given to help the affected student to continue their education.
2. Application Terms & Conditions:
  - 
  - (I) Any students of the school may apply along with proof issued by their village, town, city, or countryside council, or who are audited by the school's care group.
  - (II) The school's community care service will set up a related station, which will be vetted and approved by the school Care Group.
3. Application Time & Methods:
  - (I) The school's Care Group will take the initiative to go to an affected area to provide relief aid.
  - (II) Application should be by the student(s) concerned through the counseling group within two months of the disaster.
4. Fund Resource:
  - (I) "Urgent Relief Subsidy" fund provided by Asia University's founder.
  - (II) Fund by donation from companies contacting the school, school staff, students' donation, and fundraising etc.
  - (III) The student schooling subsidy fund will be funded through the school and tuition fee income.
5. Relief Methods:
  - (I) Applications in relation to damage to a building belonging to the student or parent must be accompanied by relevant supporting information. Aid will be limited to one payment per household.
    - a. Total destruction of house: Allowance of NT\$ 50,000 net.
    - b. Less than total destruction of house: Allowance of NT\$ 30,000 net.
    - c. Damage less than above: Allowance of NT\$ 10,000 net.
  - (II) In the event of death from a natural disaster:
    - a. Individual: Allowance of NT\$ 50,000 net.
    - b. Relative: Allowance of NT\$ 30,000 net. (grandparent, parent, spouse, children, sibling)
  - (III) Other major damage aid will be managed according to the relevant provisions issued by the Ministry of Education, or that are approved by the school's Scholarship Review Committee.
6. During an unexpected major disaster, the school's "Urgent Relief" concern group can deliberate in advance to offer aid at the time of the incident according to situation.
7. In addition to the allowances mentioned above, affected individuals may also apply to the government or school's original disaster aid fund.
8. This relief fund, and any revisions, has been approved by the executive council, and promulgated after approval by the President.
